## SECTION 4: First aid measures

#### General information

#### 4.1. Description of first aid measures

##### Inhalation

**SECTION 5: Firefighting measures**

**Special protective equipment for firefighters**

Wear suitable protective equipment. Self-contained breathing apparatus and full protective clothing must be worn in case of fire.

**Special firefighting procedures**

In case of fire and/or explosion do not breathe fumes. If tank, rail car or tank truck is involved in a fire, ISOLATE for 800 meters (1/2 mile) in all directions; also consider initial evacuation for 800 meters (1/2 mile) in all directions. ALWAYS stay away from tanks engulfed in flame. Move containers from fire area if you can do so without risk. Use water spray to cool unopened containers. Withdraw immediately in case of rising sound from venting safety device or any discoloration of tanks due to fire. For massive fire in cargo area, use unmanned hose holder or monitor nozzles, if possible. If not, withdraw and let fire burn out.

**SECTION 6: Accidental release measures**

**6.1. Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures**

**For non-emergency personnel**

Immediately evacuate personnel to safe areas. Keep unnecessary personnel away. Keep people away from and upwind of spill/leak. Eliminate all ignition sources (no smoking, flares, sparks, or flames in immediate area). Wear appropriate protective equipment and clothing during clean-up. Do not touch damaged containers or spilled material unless wearing appropriate protective clothing. Ventilate closed spaces before entering them. **7.1. Precautions for safe handling**

Do not allow contact with air. Open container carefully and only in a dry, oxygen-free or inert atmosphere. Keep away from heat/sparks/open flames/hot surfaces. - No smoking.
