Small Spills: Sweep up or vacuum up spillage and collect in suitable container for disposal.

**8.2. Exposure controls****Appropriate engineering controls**

VENTILATION: Good general ventilation (typically 10 air changes per hour) should be used. Ventilation rates should be matched to conditions.
